Leader and family together, all kneeling

- L: death no longer has dominion over him.
- F: The death that he died, he died to sin, once for all;
- L: but the life he lives, he lives to God.

- L: and alive to God in Jesus Christ our Lord. Alleluia.
- F: Christ has been raised from the dead,
- L: the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep.
- F: For since by a man came death,

- F: For as in Adam all die,

- 1 L: Hallelujah!
 Sing to the LORD a new song;
 sing his praise in the congregation of the faithful.
- **F:** Let Israel rejoice in his Maker; let the children of Zion be joyful in their King.
- 3 L: Let them praise his Name in the dance; let them sing praise to him with timbrel and harp.
- **F:** For the LORD takes pleasure in his people and adorns the poor with victory.

- 5 L: Let the faithful rejoice in triumph; let them be joyful on their beds.
- **F:** Let the praises of God be in their throat and a two-edged sword in their hand;
- **L:** To wreak vengeance on the nations and punishment on the peoples;
- **F:** To bind their kings in chains and their nobles with links of iron:
- **L:** To inflict on them the judgment decreed; this is glory for all his faithful people. Hallelujah!

- **L:** Hallelujah!
 Praise God in his holy temple;
 praise him in the firmament of his power.
- **F:** Praise him for his mighty acts; praise him for his excellent greatness.
- **L:** Praise him with the blast of the ram's-horn; praise him with lyre and harp.
- **F:** Praise him with timbrel and dance; praise him with strings and pipe.
- **L:** Praise him with resounding cymbals; praise him with loud-clanging cymbals.
- **F:** Let everything that has breath praise the Lord. Hallelujah!
