Confession of Sin

Leader and family together, all kneeling

We are truly sorry and we humbly repent.

For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ,

have mercy on us and forgive us;

and walk in your ways,

to the glory of your name. Amen.

The designated Leader alone stands and says

Almighty God have mercy on us, forgive us all our sins through our Lord Jesus Christ, strengthen us in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep us in eternal life. *Amen*.

- L: Alleluia.
- F: Christ our Passover has been sacrificed for us;
- L: therefore let us keep the feast,
- F: Not with old leaven, the leaven of malice and evil,
- L: but with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth. Alleluia.
- F: Christ being raised from the dead will never die again;
- L: death no longer has dominion over him.
- F: The death that he died, he died to sin, once for all;
- L: but the life he lives, he lives to God.
- F: So also consider yourselves dead to sin,
- L: and alive to God in Jesus Christ our Lord. Alleluia.
- F: Christ has been raised from the dead,
- L: the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep.
- F: For since by a man came death,
- L: by a man has come also the resurrection of the dead.
- F: For as in Adam all die,
- L: so in Christ shall all be made alive. Alleluia.

- **F:** Let them fall upon the edge of the sword, and let them be food for jackals.
- **L:** But the king will rejoice in God; all those who swear by him will be glad; for the mouth of those who speak lies shall be stopped.

- 1 L: Sing to the LORD a new song, for he has done marvelous things.
- **F:** With his right hand and his holy arm has he won for himself the victory.
- **L:** The LORD has made known his victory; his righteousness has he openly shown in the sight of the nations.
- **F:** He remembers his mercy and faithfulness to the house of Israel, and all the ends of the earth have seen the victory of our God.
- 5. L: Shout with joy to the LORD, all you lands; lift up your voice, rejoice, and sing.
- **F:** Sing to the LORD with the harp, with the harp and the voice of song.
- **L:** With trumpets and the sound of the horn shout with joy before the King, the LORD.

- 8 **F:** Let the sea make a noise and all that is in it, the lands and those who dwell therein.
- 9 L: Let the rivers clap their hands, and let the hills ring out with joy before the LORD, when he comes to judge the earth.
- 10 **F:** In righteousness shall he judge the world and the peoples with equity.

He descended to the dead.

the forgiveness of sins,
the resurrection of the body,
and the life everlasting. Amen.

The Prayer

Leader and Family

And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

- L. Show us your mercy, O Lord;
- F. And grant us your salvation.
- L. Clothe your ministers with righteousness;
- F. Let your people sing with joy.
- L. Give peace, O Lord, in all the world;
- F. For only in you can we live in safety.
- L. Lord, keep this nation under your care;
- F. And guide us in the way of justice and truth.
- L. Let your way be known upon earth;
- F. Your saving health among all nations.
- L. Let not the needy, O Lord, be forgotten;
- F. Nor the hope of the poor be taken away.
- L. Create in us clean hearts, O God;
- F. And sustain us with your Holy Spirit.

The Leader then says the following Prayer

O God, who for our redemption gave your only-begotten Son to the death of the cross, and by his glorious resurrection delivered us from the power of our enemy: Grant us so to die daily to sin, that we may evermore live with him in the joy of his resurrection; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. *Amen*.

We bless you for our creation, preservation, and all the blessings of this life; but above all for your immeasurable love in the redemption of the world by our Lord Jesus Christ; for the means of grace, and for the hope of glory. And, we pray, give us such an awareness of your mercies, that with truly thankful hearts we may show forth your praise, not only with our lips, but in our lives, by giving up our selves to your service, and by walking before you in holiness and righteousness all our days; through Jesus Christ our Lord, to whom, with you and the Holy Spirit, be honor and glory throughout all ages. Amen.
