## The New Covenant

What is the New Covenant: <u>The New Covenant is the redeemed relationship with God given by Jesus Christ, the Messiah,</u> to the Apostles; and, through them, to all the world by way of announcement; The Gospel, the "Good News of Salvation."

- Adam through a meal / Abraham through circumcision / Moses through the law / Prophets: Jer 31:31-33
- New covenant: new meal = Eucharist + New circumcision = baptism Col 2:11-12 / New Law = Rom 8:1-4
- Moses broke first tablets and new ones in mercy seat: Jesus flesh broke and encased us in the mercy seat
  - o Matthew 28:16-20; "Be fruitful and multiply" we are here b/c they obeyed; who will be here b/c of us?

What did the Messiah promise in the New Covenant: <u>Christ promised to bring us into the kingdom of God</u> and give life in all its fullness.

- Matthew 26:26-29: forgiveness and entrance into the kingdom: He drank on cross and with us every Sunday
- **Col 1:13-14**; not just forgiven but delivered from a power; this is why we can grow and not just repeat sin
- Luke 23:39-43: The new covenant delivers, forgives and enters us into a new Kingdom; Eden continued

What response did Christ require: <u>Christ commanded us to believe in him and to keep his commandments.</u>

- Matthew 4:17; Jesus commands that we repent
- Matthew 22:37-40; Love God and love neighbor = 10 commandments
- **Galatians 6:1-2**; bearing one another's burdens, not making them heavier is the "yoke/Law" of Christ

What are the commandments taught by Christ: <u>Christ taught us the Summary of the Law and gave us</u> <u>the New Commandment.</u>

- John 13:34-35: Christ wants to be seen most with us loving as He loved; to death.
- Matthew 5-7: Sermon on the mount = what the 10 commandments look like as "being and not doing."
- Matthew 25: Sheep and goats; Jesus commands us to live His life before and for others as Him

Where may we find what Christians believe about Christ: <u>What Christians believe about Christ is found in the Scriptures</u> summed up in the creeds, and lived out in the Spirit's witness throughout church history.

- The traditions of the early church: **2 Thessalonians 2:15** 
  - o **Confirmation = commitment the apostles teaching, breaking of bread, prayers + love of neighbor.**
